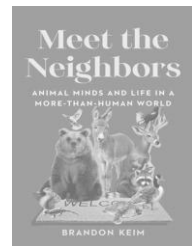
FUNDRAISING SUCCESS!

OHRV USAGE

There has been discussion regarding complaints about OHRV usage on some town roads. The selectmen remind riders that only certain roads (or sections of) are open to OHRV use, that the speed limit is 20 mph, and riding is only allowed from 30 minutes before sunrise to 30 minutes after sunset. If problems continue, OHRV use on town roads will be prohibited.

Fees are:

\$10 for unspayed/intact pet.

\$7.50 neutered/spayed.

\$2.00 Senior owned pet (1 per household.)

- Please bring a copy of records when registering a new pet or updating shots.
