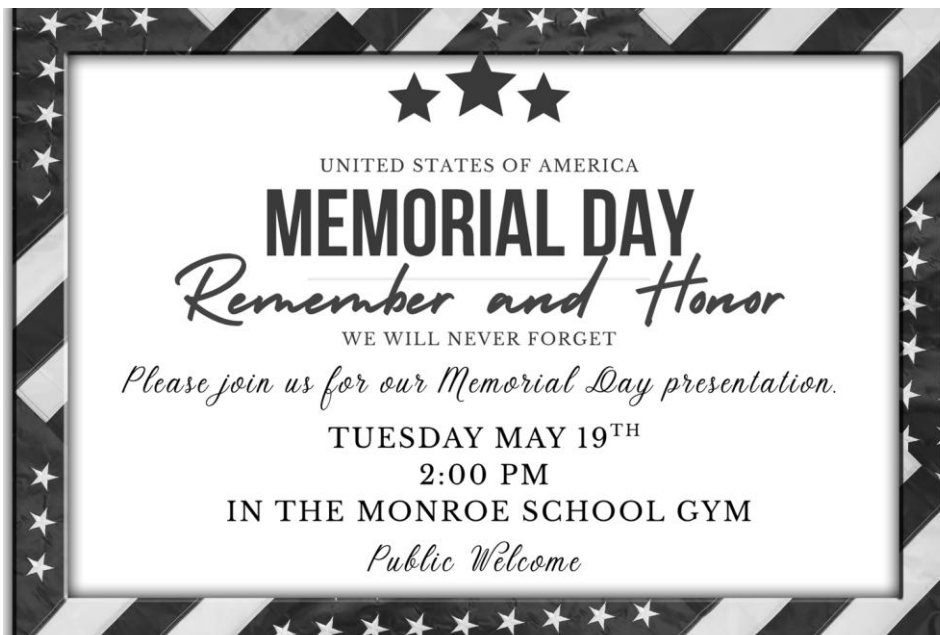

STRAWBERRY PLANTS

Strawberry plants are in and available at Sugarbush Strawberries at 967 Woodsville Road here in Monroe.

The plants are of the Albion variety. Albions are a day neutral plant and thus produce during the year of planting as opposed to most other varieties that are either everbearing or June bearers that need to grow a year before getting a crop. (You can get a limited crop by not pinching off the flowers during the first year, but at the expense of the following years crop.)

Bare root plants are available for \$1 per plant. Potted plants are available for \$5 per plant. Strawberry towers of 24 plants are available for \$100 for those who do not, or cannot, bend to pick the berries.

RECYCLING REMINDER

In Monroe, you can still recycle these items. Bins are located at the Municipal Building on the Woodsville Road, behind the ice-skating rink.

- **Metal**- like food cans, fencing, all metal items, clean aluminum foil go in the metal dumpster. **No:** items that are made from a combination of metal and plastic (or other material) such as paper shredders, coffee makers, etc.
- **Aluminum cans** - beverage cans to the wire mesh bin. The money from these benefits the 8th grade class trip.
- **Glass**- bottles and jars, ceramics, windowpanes, porcelain, sinks and toilets (fixtures must be removed). **No:** lightbulbs, headlights, windshields
