A reminder to all dog owners...

NH RSA 466 requires that all dogs must be registered by April 30 each year. If you have not done so, you are subject to fines.

As of August 1, there will be a \$25 fine, authorized by the State of New Hampshire and our Selectboard.

Please bring rabies vaccination certificate to our office to register your pet. Renewals may be done online at monroenh.org, if vaccination is up to date. If your dog is deceased or has been rehomed, please let us know.
