

Starting July 1^{st,} it will be illegal to put rechargeable lithium-ion batteries in the trash due to the risk of fires in trash haulers and waste management facilities.

Lithium-ion batteries can be found in electric bikes and scooters, cordless power tools, lawncare equipment, cell phones, laptops, tablets, wireless headphones, toys, and more.
