



MONROE FIRE DEPARTMENT

The statewide burn ban has been lifted. However, drought conditions still exist. You are reminded that permits are required for any outdoor burning until the area within a 100' radius from the fire edge is covered with snow or other frozen precipitation sufficient to prevent the combustion of woodland fuels until the fire is completely extinguished. Permits are available online at nhfirepermit.com It's also a good idea to notify dispatch at their nonemergency number (603-787-2111) before you burn in case, they receive reports of smoke/wildfire.
