BEGINNER'S GUIDE TO CEMETERY SLEUTHING



School District Fiscal Year 24 Finance Update

Monroe School ended FY24 with a fund balance of \$120,397.08. The FY24 budget was overspent by \$34,036 due to unanticipated special education expenses. This money came from the \$154,433 monies we retained from the FY23 fund balance. We also received and expended \$112,933.60 in federal grant monies during the FY24 school year.

In Person Voter Registration

If you are not registered to vote, you may do so at the Town Office thru October 22 or with the Supervisors of the Checklist at their next meeting (10/28). Please bring photo ID. Election Day registrations are allowed in New Hampshire, however, please plan ahead to avoid voting delays.

Absentee Voter Registration

If you will not be in Monroe at this time (i.e. you're a student attending college), you may still register to vote. To do so, contact the town clerk's office and request the proper paperwork. You may request an absentee ballot at the same time.
