MONROE WATER DEPARTMENT

- If you have not already done so, please return the water line survey that was included in your April billing. Copies are available at the Town Office, if you need one. This is a Federal mandated project.
- The Consumer Confidence Report for the Monroe Water Department is available on our website (www.monroenh.org).
- Rates are increasing as of July 1st due to continued increases in cost of operation and repairs to the system.

Meter rental will be \$12.00 (currently \$10) Water will be \$8.00 per 1,000 gallons (currently \$6.33)

Most households will increase between \$10 and \$12 per quarter.

OUTSIDE BURNING

Remember that you must obtain a fire permit before starting any outside fire.

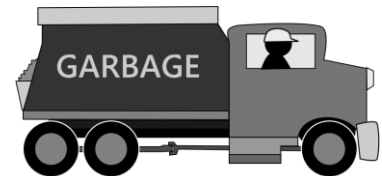

SUMMER FUN ISN'T JUST FOR KIDS!




